Left Unity candidates stand on our record of achieving progress for our members. We believe in accountability to members, consultation with members and importantly abiding by the democratically arrived at decisions of members.

#### **LEFT UNITY CANDIDATES RECORD OF ACHIEVEMENTS**

Over the last 12 months we believe we have made some significant progress within HMRC;

#### **PAY**

The organising strategy designed and implemented by Left Unity resulted in a 10% increase of votes in the National Campaign re-ballot, propelling us over the anti-trade union 50% threshold and enabling us to secure a legal mandate to join in national action and deliver effective targeted industrial action within the group.

#### **This action achieved:**

- A 2.5% increase on the original pay remit of 2% to departments, increasing the average rise to 4.5%.
- A one-off payment of £1500 (Pro-rated) for all staff.
- National talks on greater departmental pay cohesion and structural reform in our pay systems for the first time since pay was delegated to Departments in the 1990s.
- National talks on tackling low pay in the Civil Service.

In recent weeks it is Left Unity members of the GEC who have forced HMRC to retain the 42 hours pay calculation in respect of the National Minimum Wage, meaning that in April all staff at AA and AO national pay grades will see an increase to their salary.

We have also forced HMRC to admit that staff in our Inland Pre Clearance-Hubs are entitled to Shift Disturbance Allowances, this has resulted in thousands of pounds of backpay for these members.

These represent real achievements that put real money in members pockets but we are clear that it is not enough, which is why Left Unity candidates support the current national ballot for Industrial action.

Left Unity remains opposed to the arbitrary 60% office attendance edict and will continue to campaign for its removal.

Electing Left Unity candidates for GEC and NEC elections will ensure that we are able to work positively with the newly elected General Secretary to deliver further improvements for HMRC members on pay and conditions.

Defending public services = Defending jobs

HMRC have embarked on various ill thought out adventures over the last few months, all of which Left Unity have opposed. They've tried to encourage members in CSG to voluntarily give up their contractual right to Flexi by offering a 1% annual attendance allowance, they've also encouraged members to sell their annual leave back to the dept in a shameless and cynical attempt to squeeze more work out of our members by exploiting the fact that our members are struggling on poverty pay levels. All of these projects are attempts to paper over the cracks of a dept that no longer has enough resources to deliver a basic service to the public.

In the last few weeks, we have seen the real consequences that the chronic under-funding in HMRC is having.

In March, after a damning report from the Public Accounts Committee setting out that customer service levels were at an all-time low as a result of conscious decisions made by the department, HMRC announced that they planned to fix this by closing a number of customer helplines. Left Unity members of the GEC were fast to respond and oppose these plans, adding to the pressure that led to an astonishing U turn less than 24 hours later. We are clear that any cuts to the services that we deliver will ultimately result in cuts to jobs, we have seen this time and time again. It would be naive to think that HMRC's drive to push customers onto digital platforms will not result in cuts to staff numbers.

Left Unity will continue to argue that the only way to fix the issues in HMRC; be it a broken pay system, micromanagement or indeed customer service levels, is by campaigning for significant investment in the department. To achieve this members need a strong and united leadership, the type of leadership that only Left Unity candidates have the experience and courage to deliver.
